SASKATCHEWAN GOVERNMENT TO PROVIDE \$250K TO AID VICTIMS OF TYPHOON HAIYAN

experiencing the heartbreak of family members and friends following the aftermath of the typhoon.

GOVERNMENT INVESTS IN HOME FIRST/QUICK RESPONSE PROGRAM FOR SENIORS IN SASKATOON

Seniors in Saskatoon and area will benefit from an innovative program to help them remain safely in their homes longer. Government is investing \$2 million into a new Home First/Quick Response Home Care pilot project in Saskatoon.

The Saskatoon initiative builds on government's previous \$2 million investment in a similar project launched in Regina this summer.

Health Minister Dustin Duncan officially launched the Saskatoon pilot at an event held at Scott and Forget Towers today.

"The Home First/Quick Response initiative reflects our government's commitment to patient- and family-centred care, and our growth agenda goal of improving the quality of life for all

Saskatchewan people," Duncan said. "We want our seniors to have the appropriate care, at the right time, and be able to live independently in their own homes and communities for as long as possible."

The pilot's aim is to improve access for seniors to supports in the community that will allow them to safely age within their own homes and progress with other care options as their needs change. The pilot will:

- Enhance and improve Home Care's response to crisis and intensive short-term service needs;
- Encourage early discharge from acute care to community options;
- Prevent unnecessary admissions to emergency departments; and
- Engage additional service providers in the system to support seniors in their homes.

HEADSTART ON A HOME PROJECT OPEN IN SASKATOON

Twelve Saskatoon individuals and families are celebrating the opening of Mosaic, a new 12-unit condominium located at 313 Avenue D South in the Riversdale neighbourhood of Saskatoon. The Government of Saskatchewan provided \$1.98 million in financing assistance to the developer, Shift Developments, through the HeadStart on a Home (HeadStart) program.

"This is yet another successful project undertaken by various partners working together to improve the quality of life of Saskatchewan people," Social Services Minister and Minister responsible for Saskatchewan Housing Corporation June Draude said. "HeadStart is a wonderful way to help moderate-income individuals and families purchase an entry-level home, and to foster more partnerships between the private sector and different levels of government to create homeownership opportunities. We will continue to help make this possible as we move forward with our government's Plan for Growth."

"HeadStart is a made-in-Saskatchewan solution that will help sustain our current growth and

prosperity in this province," Westcap Mgt. Ltd. President and CEO Grant Kook said. "As the Fund Manager of HeadStart, working closely with our Credit Union partners, we are very pleased to report that there are currently 912 homes either completed or currently under construction, including this 12-unit project in collaboration with the City of Saskatoon."



For the tenth straight month, Saskatchewan has held the lowest unemployment rate in Canada. According to October's Labour Force Survey released today by Statistics Canada, the province's unemployment rate fell by 0.7 percentage points to reach 3.6 per cent, well below the 6.9 per cent reported nationally.

"One of the best measures of our economic success is the ability of people to find jobs," Parks, Culture and Sport Minister Kevin Doherty said on behalf of Economy Minister Bill Boyd. "The opportunities for people to find work in Saskatchewan have never been better."

HEALTH LEADERS ENCOURAGE PROACTIVE APPROACH TO FLU SEASON

Position Statement Recommends Voluntary Immunization or Masking

Saskatchewan health care providers are being strongly encouraged to get an influenza immunization or choose to wear a mask while delivering care and services to patients during flu season.

Provincial health system partners have issued a position statement on the issue, signed by Health Minister Dustin Duncan, CEOs from health regions and the Saskatchewan Cancer Agency, the Saskatchewan Medical Association (SMA) and the Saskatchewan Registered Nurses Association (SRNA). The statement underscores the importance of health care providers taking action to protect patients and themselves from the potentially significant effects of influenza.

"Patient safety is our first priority, and this is one simple way that we can continue to put our patients first," Duncan said. "We need to make every effort to prevent the spread of influenza for the sake of patients and staff in our health facilities."

SASKJOBS WEBSITE TRAFFIC INCREASES IN OCTOBER

Saskatchewan's job market continues to attract heavy traffic to the <u>SaskJobs.ca</u> website, which again topped a million visits for the month of October.

Visits to <u>SaskJobs.ca</u> were up by 14 per cent (141,531) year-over-year to reach 1,155,934. The 17,392 job postings advertised on SaskJobs in October 2013 represents an increase of 7.0 per cent (1,134) compared to October 2012.

"Saskatchewan currently has what many people across the country and around the globe are actively looking for - thousands of jobs in an opportunity-rich economy," Economy Minister Bill Boyd said. "Their search is taking them to <u>SaskJobs.ca</u>. We have had the lowest unemployment rate in the country for the past 10 months, and at 3.6 per cent in October, compared to 6.9 per cent nationally, it reinforces the message that Saskatchewan is indeed the place to be."

MACKINNON PROPOSES SASKATCHEWAN FUTURES FUND

Opportunity to Build Lasting Legacy From Natural Resource Revenues

On November 12, Peter MacKinnon, former President of the University of Saskatchewan, released his report to Premier Brad Wall on a proposed Saskatchewan Futures Fund. The report provides a framework for the government to create a fund to permanently save a portion of our province's non-renewable resource revenues to invest and grow for future generations.

"We owe it to our children and grandchildren, and to their children and grandchildren, to take a deliberate and balanced look at how we can secure today's resource wealth into the future,"

MacKinnon said. "A permanent savings account in the form of a Futures Fund could turn our one-time revenue from these resources into a lasting source of wealth for Saskatchewan people."

SASKATCHEWAN ORDER OF MERIT - DR. GEORGE R. REED



As a part of the six-week feature on the Saskatchewan Order of Merit winners, this week we honour Dr. George R. Reed

Dr. George Reed is a living legend of the Saskatchewan Roughriders and the CFL, playing for them for 13 years. He has played in four Grey Cup Championships and lead the CFL in rushing nine times. Also in honour of the 100th Grey Cup in 2012, Canada Post used his image on a

series of commemorative stamps.

Upon retirement from professional football, he served with several community oriented organizations, including the Canadian and Saskatchewan Special Olympics, the Saskatchewan Abilities Council, the United Way and he chaired the Easter Seals campaign.

By far his greatest accomplishment was the official establishment of the George Reed Foundation for the Handicapped in 1974. The Foundation also supports the Mother Teresa Middle School, and partnered up with the University of Regina to create a vision for a centre of research and development in the area of Pictogram research and other forms of visual communication.

Along with several prestigious Football awards such as the Schenley Award in 1965 for most outstanding player, he has also been invested as a Member of the Order of Canada in 1978, received the Commemorative Medal for the 125th Anniversary of the Confederation of Canada in 1992, and most recently the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal in 2012.

In this we honour Dr. George Reed, for all of his outstanding contributions to the communities of Saskatchewan in the advancement of the disabled, and for many amazing years playing for our Roughriders.
