

FULL TIME JOBS HIT A RECORD HIGH IN SEPTEMBER

The number of people employed on a full-time basis hit a record in September, according to new figures released by Statistics Canada today. Full-time employment was 465,100 last month, the highest ever for the month of September and up 11,800 from a year ago. More than 80 per cent of the new jobs created in Saskatchewan in the past year were full-time jobs while across Canada, fewer than half of the new jobs created were full-time.

"More jobs, more people and more economic activity continue to make Saskatchewan the place to be," Energy and Resources Minister Tim McMillan said. "The increase in full-time jobs is impressive as it provides working people with more stability and security which leads to a better quality of life."

URBAN HOUSING STARTS UP 26.6% IN SASKATOON

Saskatchewan's home builders were among of the busiest in the nation in September, according to a report on urban housing starts released by CMHC on October 8. Urban housing starts were up 23.4 per cent in September 2013 on a year-over-year basis. Saskatchewan had the highest percentage increase in Canada on an annual basis, well above the 4.2 per cent recorded nationally.

On an annual basis, urban housing starts were up by 16.2 per cent in Regina, 26.6 per cent in Saskatoon and 25.9 per cent in other urban centres. The largest year-over-year increase occurred in multiple units, which had an increase of 63.7 per cent over last year from 485 units to 794 units.

BCDR Mechanical, a business that services fleet trucks and trailers, started their family business after years of practical business experience, and now has many family members involved. Although each business would be an excellent representative of the values pursued by family business, BCDR came away as winner of the award. Their business focus on family governance and succession planning were the key elements promoted in the application process. We congratulate Brent and Charlena Robinson, and know that their business will be excellent candidates for the CAFÉ National award to be announced at a gala event in Vancouver next May.

PREMIER BRAD WALL SAYS FREE TRADE WITH ASEAN REGION MUST BE A PRIORITY

Saskatchewan Premier Brad Wall called for a renewed Canadian focus on building new opportunities with member countries of the Association of South East Asian Nations (ASEAN).

Wall told an audience of roughly 175 corporate executives and government leaders that ASEAN

countries must be a higher priority.

Premier Wall used his ASEAN speech to announce the formation of a new body, to assist the Saskatchewan government in meeting its ambitious trade expansion goals.

The new eight-member Saskatchewan-Asia Advisory Council will provide advice on increasing trade, recruitment of international students, innovation and investment attraction.
