Saskatchewan's population has surpassed the 1.1 million mark for the first time ever after growing by more than 100,000 people since 2007.

New population figures released September 26 by Statistics Canada show Saskatchewan's population was 1,108,303 as of July 1, 2013. That's an increase of 106,255 since July 1, 2007.

Saskatchewan's population grew by 20,757 in the past year and 6,895 in the past quarter – the largest increase in any quarter since Statistics Canada began keeping quarterly estimates.

Premier Brad Wall said the rapid growth shows the strength of Saskatchewan's economy and even surpassed the government's goal of 100,000 more people in 10 years.

Saskatchewan has not seen this kind of population growth since the province's early days. Saskatchewan's population grew rapidly during the province's first 25 years – from 236,000 when the province was formed in 1905 to just over 900,000 in 1930.

After that, Saskatchewan's population did more fluctuating than growing. It then took until 1983 for Saskatchewan's population to reach the one million mark for the first time. It dropped back below one million in 2001 before finally hitting one million again in 2007.

Last fall, the government set a new goal: 1.2 million people by 2020.

PROVINCE SUPPORTS RENOVATIONS OF HOUSING PROJECT IN SASKATOON

Through the combined efforts of the Government of Saskatchewan, the City of Saskatoon and Stewart Property Holdings, a vacant rooming house located at 525-20th Street will re-emerge as an affordable home for 12 Saskatoon individuals and families.

The \$1.5 million project is being undertaken by developer Stewart Property Holdings. The Government of Saskatchewan, through Saskatchewan Housing Corporation, is contributing \$490,000 to the initiative from the provincial Summit Action Fund. The remaining funding of \$1,060,000 will be provided through private lender financing, with an additional \$2,500 contributed by the City of Saskatoon for the rehabilitation of the building facade.

This project is aligned with a number of strategic priorities that were outlined in the Government of Saskatchewan's Provincial Housing Strategy. These priorities include the need to increase

housing supply, to improve housing affordability and to support individuals and families in greatest need of housing. Since November 2007, 1,029 affordable rental units have been completed in Saskatoon. An additional 52 rental units are currently under construction in Saskatoon including 525-20th Street West.

The building, which was constructed in the early 1900's and has been vacant since 2009, will have two residential floors converted to 12 one- and two-bedroom suites. Commercial space will be available on the main floor. The historic building is within walking distance to downtown and accessible to amenities including a food store, medical clinic and community centre.
